Every U.S. citizen and resident alien must have health insurance (minimum essential coverage). Failure to have insurance may result in a penalty (an additional tax) to be paid when filing the annual tax return. Certain individuals may be exempt from this requirement, such as income below the filing requirement,	coverage is unaffordable, or the person suffered a hardship making it difficult to obtain coverage. If an employer does no provide health insurance coverage, individuals can obtain cov erage through the Health Insurance Marketplace. A person may be eligible for the credit if he or she meets all of the following:  • Buys health insurance through the Marketplace,  • Is ineligible for coverage through an employer or government plan,  • Is within certain income limits,  • Files a joint return, if married, and	Report changes in circumstances. If a person receives advance payments of the premium tax credit to help pay for insurance premiums, report changes such as income or family size to the marketplace when they happen. Reporting changes will make sure the person gets the correct amount of the advanced credit. Receiving too much or too little in advance can affect the person's refund or balance due when filing the tax return.
